Dear Department Chairs and Program Directors,

Please make your students aware of the Academically Related Activities (ARA) & Student Academic Development (SAD) Grants to help reimburse expenses for going to conferences, workshops, and/or academic competitions/artistic performances (registration fees, travel, lodging, etc.). These can be applied for well in advance of the actual trip, and since the funds are available on a first-come first-serve basis, it would be good for anyone who is going to conferences this Fall or Spring to submit an application as soon as they know they will be attending (they can apply before receiving an official acceptance from the conference). There is a single application for both grants, and they will be

awarded to the students to try and give them the maximum reimbursement possible. Students do not need to be presenting at the conference (but their maximum reimbursement amount is a little less). Student that have already attended conferences this Fall 2016 can still apply to receive reimbursement.
